issues of same sex relationships and gay and lesbian rights are the subject of public and political controversy in many african societies today frequently these controversies receive widespread attention both locally and globally such as with the anti homosexuality bill in uganda in the international media these cases tend to be presented as revealing a deeply rooted homophobia in africa fuelled by religious and cultural traditions but so far little energy is expended in understanding these controversies in all their complexity and the critical role religion plays in them this is the first book with multidisciplinary perspectives on religion and homosexuality in africa it presents case studies from across the continent from egypt to zimbabwe and from senegal to kenya and covers religious traditions such as islam christianity and rastafarianism the contributors explore the role of religion in the politicisation of homosexuality investigate local and global mobilisations of power critically examine dominant religious discourses and highlight the emergence of counter discourses hence they reveal the crucial yet ambivalent public role of religion in matters of sexuality social justice and human rights in contemporary africa

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tend to be presented as revealing a deeply rooted homophobia in africa fuelled by religious and cultural traditions but so far little energy is expended in understanding these controversies in all their complexity and the critical role religion plays in them complementing the companion volume public religion and the politics of homosexuality in africa this book investigates christian politics and discourses on homosexuality in sub saharan africa the contributors present case studies from various african countries from nigeria to south africa and from cameroon to uganda focusing on pentecostal catholic and mainline protestant churches they critically examine popular christian theologies that perpetuate homophobia and discrimination but they also discuss contestations of such discourses and emerging alternative christian perspectives that contribute to the recognition of sexual diversity social justice and human rights in contemporary africa

this book examines the contributions both intentional and unintentional of nigerian pentecostal churches and ngos to development studying their development practices broadly in relation to the intersecting spheres of politics economics health education human rights and peacebuilding in sub saharan africa pentecostalism is fast becoming the dominant expression of christianity but while the growth and civic engagement of these churches has been well documented their role in development has received less attention the nigerian pentecostal landscape is one of the most vibrant in africa churches are increasingly assuming more prominent roles as they seek to address the social and moral ills of contemporary society often in fierce competition with islam for dominance in nigerian public space some scholars suggest that the combination of an enchanted worldview an emphasis on miracles and prosperity teaching and a preoccupation with evangelism discourages effective political engagement and militates against development however nigerian pentecostalism and development argues that there is an emerging movement within contemporary nigerian pentecostalism which is becoming increasingly active in development practices this book goes on to explore the increasingly transnational approach that churches take often seeking to build multicultural congregations around the globe for instance in britain and the united states nigerian pentecostalism and development spirit power and transformation will be of considerable interest to scholars and students concerned with the intersection between religion and development and to development practitioners and policy makers working in the region

major cities have long been seen as centres of secularisation however the number of congregations in london grew by 50 between 1979 and the present london s churches have been characterised more by growth than by decline in the decades since 1980 the desecularisation of the city provides the first academic survey of churches in london over recent decades linking them to similar developments in other major cities across the west produced by a large team of scholars from a range of disciplines this volume offers a striking and original portrait of congregational life in london since 1980 seventeen chapters explore the diverse localities ethnicities and denominations that make up the church in contemporary london the vitality of london s churches in the last four decades shows that secularisation is far from inevitable in the cities of the future this study necessitates a significant reassessment of the dominant academic portrayal of christianity in britain and the west which has mostly depicted cities as secular spaces within a secularising culture it will be of great interest to scholars working across a wide range of disciplines including history sociology religious studies and theology

fast growing in population african immigrants in the united states have become a significant force to the point that the idea of a new african diaspora is now a reality this thriving community has opened new arenas of scholarly discourse on black atlantic history beyond the trans atlantic slave trade and its legacies this book investigates the complex dynamic forces that have shaped and continue to shape this new diaspora in eleven original essays the volume examines pertinent themes such as immigration integration dilemmas identity construction brain drain remittances

expanding african religious space and how these dynamics impact and intersect with the african homeland with contributors from both sides of the atlantic that represent a diverse range of academic disciplines this book offers a broad perspective on emerging themes in contemporary african diasporan experiences the book will be of interest to scholars and students of african and african american studies sociology and history

this book charts the profound changes in british christianity over the last century it does so through the medium of diverse local case studies based on high quality new research the ethnic diversification of british churches in the last fifty years is a key theme of the volume overall the chapters show how secularization has had different trajectories in different parts of the country alongside this the book charts the surprising desecularisation of parts of britain in recent decades

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
